Pattern

Worsted weight yarn on 16" circular needles size US 8

Cast on 100 stitches

Work in k2, p2 ribbing for 4.25"

Change to stockinette (k all) until piece measures 8" from cast on edge.

Bind off all stitches and seam or turn inside out and bind off using 3-needle bind-off
